

Information for EEA-citizens

Dear Madam or Sir,

Since January 1, 2006, there have been new legal regulations for EEA-citizens staying in Austria.

You registered in the City of Innsbruck after January 1, 2006. When you (and your family) claim your right to stay **longer than three months** in Austria, we request that you report **immediately** or **at the latest four months after your registration** to the City of Innsbruck.

Please bring with you the following documents:

- 15 Euro
- passport or identity card
- means of subsistence (e.g. wage or salary statement and pay slip); - for students: **proof of support by parents**, bank-statement, scholarship, etc.
- proof of sufficient health insurance (European health insurance card)

When you work in Austria we also need

- proof of employment (work contract, if you are not self-employed) or
- proof that you are self-employed (e.g. trade license)

If you are studying or attend a school in Austria please bring

- proof of enrollment (from school or university)

For family members who also settle in Austria we need documents for the family relationship (e.g. marriage certificate, birth certificate, etc.).

Please note that if you don't register your residence at the municipal council, this will be an administration offence which will be punished with a fine of up to € 200.
